The Fund invests globally in a combination of assets. Predominantly these are shares and company or government bonds. Shares held will satisfy Sarasin's thematic process and generally 40-80% of the Fund's assets will be invested in shares. It is not constrained by geography, sector or style but manages risk through a variety of theme characteristics. The bonds will mainly be priced in US Dollars. The Fund will not track an index. Derivatives (financial instruments whose value is linked to the expected future price movements of an underlying asset) may be used only with the aim of reducing risk or costs, or generating additional capital
